How To Care for Your New Fiddle-leafed Fig

- Leave it in its plastic nursery pot. Do NOT disturb the roots by trying to repot it.
- Optional: Set the nursery pot inside a more attractive planter of your choice and cover the top with Spanish moss.
- Place your Fig in front of and close to a sunny window that is completely uncovered. This is NOT a low light plant. It does NOT need protection from direct sunlight.
- Water it thoroughly once per week until a little water runs through the drain holes.
- Some leaf spotting and discoloration of lower leaves is normal. Expect some leaf loss initially as the plant acclimates to the reduced light of your home.
- Fertilize no more than once per month at half-strength. No need to mist or increase humidity.
- Keep temps above 50 degrees F. and below 90 degrees.
- Prune back or pinch out new growth to keep the tree from becoming too large for your space.
